Dirceu Greco, M.D., PhD, professor emeritus, Infectious Diseases and Bioethics, at the Federal University of Minas Gerais, Brazil, Chair of Brazilian Society of Bioethics (2019-2021), undertook an important role in the Working Group of the 2016 revision of the CIOMS ethical guidelines for health-related research¹⁾. During the HIV/AIDS crisis of 1980s to 1990s, he was engaged in taking care of people at risk and living with HIV and in an early phase AIDS vaccine trials as a principal investigator. He directed the Brazilian AIDS programme from 2010-2013 and participated in the national policy development for HIV/AIDS prevention and treatment in Brazil. During the period of the 1990s to the 2000s, he directly participated in the international debates concerning the revision of the Declaration of Helsinki as well as other UNAIDS/WHO guidelines on bioethics and HIV/AIDS, towards the establishment of the ethics of international collaborative clinical research for developing countries.

This time, we have privilege to invite Prof. Greco to the international symposium at the meeting of the Japanese Society of Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics(JSCPT), and in addition to it, we will take opportunity to another lecture, to have further discussion in depth on research ethics and bioethics. We also wish to learn the essence of Brazilian philosophy which we can find in Paulo Freire's Pedagogy of the Oppressed; the discussion on policies utilizing compulsory licensing to ensure access to drug for the people in the world who need it.

Basically discussion is in English. Takeo Saio and Chieko Kurihara will have short introductory presentations and/or explanation in Japanese and/or English, up to the participants.
